1. Show rules will follow national show rules.
2. Entry Deadline: August 15, 2018.

3. **Entry fee of \$5.00 per head** is due at the time entries are submitted. Fees are charged *for all junior and adult entries*. Make checks payable to Pine Tree Holstein Association.
4. Added entries will be accepted until 6 p.m. on Sunday, August 26. A **late entry fee of \$25.00 per head** will be assessed for any animals that are not entered prior to the August 15th deadline and any entry payments received after that deadline. Please send in entries prior to the deadline and make sure that payment is included with the entry form.
5. Cattle must be in place by 9 a.m. Sunday, August 26 and remain in place until 5:00 p.m. August 27. (May arrive before Sunday.)
6. Entries and production verification will be conducted by *6 p.m. on Sunday, August 26*. All animals must be entered and entry payments must be received by this time. Animals will not be allowed to show without payment of the entry fee.
7. Junior clipping contest will take place Sunday at 5:00 p.m. and junior showmanship will be Monday morning before the conformation classes.

The Maine Junior Holstein Show will be held this year at Windsor Fairgrounds, Windsor, Maine. The **Clipping contest** will begin promptly at 5:00 p.m., Sunday, August 26. The **Showmanship contest** will be at 9:00 a.m. Monday August 27, prior to the Conformation classes. Juniors will exhibit their animals in the Conformation classes in conjunction with the Open Show.

REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATING IN THE JUNIOR SHOW

1. Participation is open to all boys and girls between the ages of 9 and 21 with registered Holsteins. Exhibitors must not have reached their twenty-first (21) birthday before January 1 in the year competing.
2. Exhibitors must be a member of the ME & N.E. Junior Holstein Association but exhibitors need not be a member of a 4-H club. Invited guests must be members of the ME and NE Junior Holstein Association and may participate in the conformation classes for the junior show but must participate in the Showmanship contest.
3. Entry Deadline: August 15, 2018.

8. Any animal shown in the Junior Show must be either registered in junior's names OR have legitimate lease forms. Multiple juniors may be listed on the registration paper but **CANNOT** be owned with a

41. Get of Sire – Three animals sired by one bull; at least one over 2 yrs. of age and at least two animals must be owned by exhibitor. **LIMIT ONE (1) ENTRY PER FARM BY SAME BULL.**

senior member. **NO TRANSFERS WILL BE ACCEPTED.** *Lease forms need to be signed by 5/1/18 for Eastern States participants and by 6/1/18 for all others.*

9. Junior members **MUST** show their own animal in order to receive junior recognition. The **ONLY** exception to this rule is if a junior has more than one animal in a class. In this case, another junior may show the additional animal(s).
10. All exhibitors in the Junior Show **MUST** participate in at least the showmanship portion of the show.
11. We will award Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor Awards. Each Premier Award will be based on three (3) animals **MAXIMUM**, with points evenly distributed among young and mature classes.

NOTE: There is no minimum age requirement to participate in the Maine State Show. Persons under 21 will only receive Junior recognition if they meet the Junior requirements previously stated.

CLIPPING AND SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST

1. All participating juniors are required to wear show whites for the showmanship portion of the contest or disqualification of Junior status will result.
2. All exhibitors in the Junior Show **MUST** participate in at least the Showmanship portion of the contest. Members must show an animal in the Senior Yearling class or younger, unless they exhibit an animal in cow classes only.
3. Exhibitors must be a member of the ME and N.E. Junior Holstein Association or an invited guest.
4. The contest will begin Sunday evening with **PHASE 1** of the contest, the Clipping portion. Approximately one-half hour will be allowed for each contestant to gather their equipment and get set up to clip. One hour will then be allotted for each contestant to clip his or her animal. Each contestant is allowed one (1) helper to hold and steady the animal. The helper **MUST** be of junior age. When the hour is up for Phase 1, the contestants will be judged on **CLIPPING ONLY**, starting with seniors and followed by juniors.
5. **PHASE 2**, the Showmanship portion, will begin Monday morning with seniors, 15 years or older as of the Show followed by the juniors. This portion will be conducted much like any other showmanship class except it will be judged on **SHOWMANSHIP ONLY**.
6. Final placings will be determined 50% on Phase 1- Clipping and 50% on Phase 2 - Showmanship. Any ties will be broken by the highest placing in Phase 1. First place will be awarded in showmanship and clipping in addition to the overall winner.

REMEMBER: Juniors wishing to participate only in the Clipping and Showmanship may do so. They do not have to use their own animal if it is not convenient to have an animal only for the contest.

Anyone who wishes to participate in the Clipping portion of the contest should plan to bring at least one (1) animal to be used in the Clipping Contest. The animal should be in a condition making it easy to clip (i.e. somewhat trained, washed, and the head clipped). If you are unable to bring an animal, please contact Leanne Moon at 207-474-6612 as soon as possible so that we can make necessary arrangements.

8. Use of show harnesses is required and are to be provided by each exhibitor.
9. Premier Breeder and Exhibitor points will be computed on six (6) head.
10. Judge to designate outstanding showman/sportsman of show.
11. Fair cattle for the Windsor Fair shows will stay until Labor Day. Windsor offers attractive premiums and encourages Holstein Breeders to participate. Contact Curtis Prime, Supt.
12. **Judge's reception follows show:**
Food, spirits, and merriment
Presentation of Showman/Sportsman Award
Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor awards

*The judge's reception provides exhibitors a chance to visit with the Judge, breeders, and guests. Exhibitors are encouraged to contribute any food or beverage in an effort to make this a memorable event to all participating.
13. There will be a herdsmanship contest with premiums of \$50 (1st), \$25 (2nd) and \$25 (3rd). To be considered, a minimum of six (6) head must be included in the exhibit. An exhibit is limited to a single ownership. If more than one owner is cooperating in presenting an exhibit, the person in charge must be designated when entries are checked. Entries will be judged based on:
 - a. Care and presentation of cattle;
 - b. Effectiveness of display in promoting cattle and/or dairy products; and,
 - c. Attitude of personnel involved with the exhibit toward fairgoers, prospective customers, and fair management.
14. There will be a railbird judging contest on one milking class and one heifer class. This will include a small entry fee. Winners will be announced at the judge's reception and money prizes awarded in both Junior and Senior categories.
15. 2019 judges voting ballots will be available at the show.
